Having decided that a readily accessible platform was needed to make the resources available, we are in the process of building a new website which will appear to sit within the Trust webpages, yet be situated on a separate server. There are several reasons for this but mainly it is so that we have the extra storage space needed and increased design flexibility. The website name is still being considered – the aim is for something easy to remember, but which doesn't overlap with other websites such as VetGrad. One suggestion, the 'Vet

The Focus group was a highly successful affair and will soon be followed by another. The aim of the group was to gain a deeper insight into new graduates' experiences during their first year in practice and their interpretation of what resources would be useful to them. The use of this type of research tool allows us to collect far richer information than could be obtained from surveys or interviews. We were not disappointed. As one person said it 'exceeded expectations'.

We are very pleased with the range of resources we have collected. Videos, podcasts, interactive tutorials, flash programmes and PDF documents are all on the new site. New OER are still being

considered and licensed, and our hope is that the website will remain dynamic, being updated and added to after the end of the project.
